Liberia & Cervical Cancer



- In Liberia about 656 new cases (Globacon 2020)
- Rank # 1, account for 18% of all cancer cases nationally and 30.9% of all cancer cases in females
- leading cause of cancer death among women in Liberia and the second most common cancer in women ages 15-44
- No National Screening program
- Newly Established Cancer Registry
- National HPV Vaccination program targeting girls 9 yrs. since Nov. 2019
- Only 1 in 10 girls in the primary cohort (9yrs) have received HPV vaccine (WHO, Liberia Cervical Cancer profile , 2021)





PHIL Interventions towards elimination of cervical cancer

- Demand generation for uptake of promotion of HPV vaccine using its Y-Choice adolescent program in school and Integrated community-based health program
- Advocacy for policies and programs influencing around Cervical cancer elimination
- Screening and Early Detection through Conduct of "See and Treat" mobile outreach clinics





How can EPI- MoH Leverage on PHIL's Interventions

- Strengthen coordination
- Be intentional about partnering with local organizations that have the network and platform
- Adopt PHIL Strategy of integrating HPV vaccine demand generation messages with others programs or interventions across and outside of the health sector
