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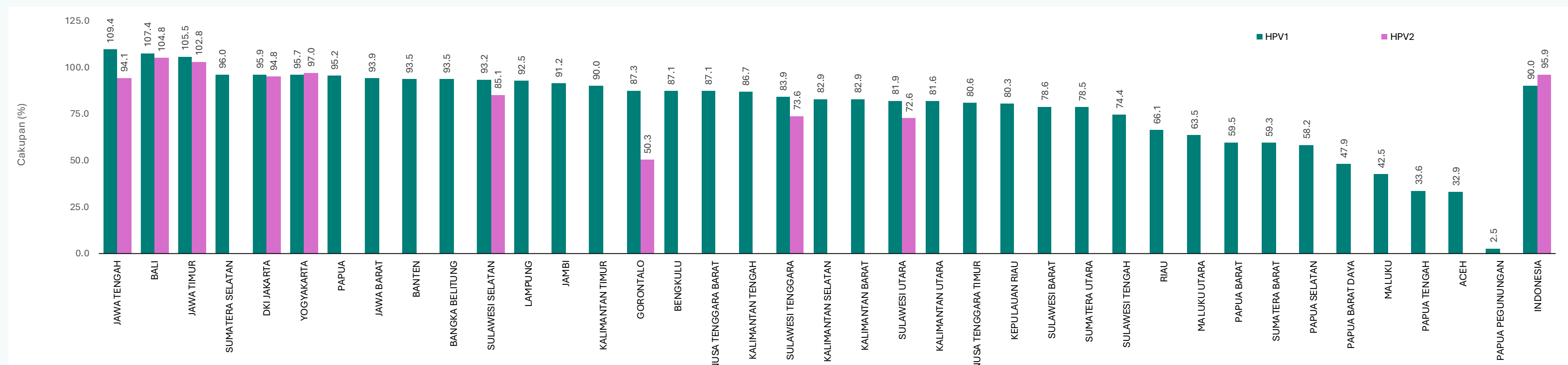
Programme Status

- HPV vaccine introduction : nationally
- Year of Introduction: 2016 in phase manner and nationwide in 2023
- Targeting 5th and 6th grade or aged 11 to 12 years old

Dosing Schedule

- Vaccine product – HPV Quadrivalent
- Number of doses administered: two doses
- Target cohort: 4.3 million girls aged 11 to 12 years old (Year 2024)

Coverage - 2023



The coverage of HPV1 and HPV2 were > 90%

Implementation Strategy

- School based platform for school girls and primary health facility for out-of-school girl
- Social mobilization (leverage social media platforms, community engagement- CSOs, interactive communication – meetings, workshops, etc), joint decree four ministers to support implementation of the HPV vaccination
- Demand generation strategies (develop IEC material, electronic HPV vaccination certificate, electronic reporting and recording)

Best practices

- Collaboration approach through establishing a joint decree from multiple ministries (Health, Education, Religion, and Home Affairs) to harmonize the implementation of immunization for students including the HPV vaccination program at the local levels

Barriers

- Indonesia has more than 17,000 islands. Implementation of HPV vaccination in remote areas poses logistical challenges and reaching out of school girls (OOS) as limited information on the true size of the OOS population and its location.
- High vaccine price

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
